Gratte Brothers Security Management: central London development is presented with an International Safety Award for protecting its employees from the risk of injury and ill health at work

Gratte Brothers Security Management: central London development has won an International Safety Award from the British Safety Council in recognition of its commitment to keeping its workers and workplaces healthy and safe during the 2021 calendar year.

Gratte Brothers Security Management: central London development is one of 135 organisations to win a Distinction in the International Safety Awards 2022.

Now in their 64th year, the [International Safety Awards](#) recognise and celebrate organisations from around the world which have demonstrated to the satisfaction of the scheme's independent judges their commitment to preventing workplace injuries and work-related ill health during the previous calendar year. The awards also acknowledge organisations that have shown commitment to wellbeing and mental health at work.

In 2022, 549 organisations won an International Safety Award. They span all sectors with significant representation from the construction, manufacturing, oil, gas, mining, power and utility sectors. Winners were drawn from 39 countries worldwide. 135 organisations were awarded a Distinction, 204 organisations were awarded a Merit and 210 organisations achieved a Pass.

About the International Safety Awards scheme

The [International Safety Awards](#) are open to organisations of all types, sizes and sectors in the UK and internationally, both members of the British Safety Council and non-members, and relate to the health and safety management at a specific site or business unit. The awards include a range of auto enter awards as well as free to enter awards.

Applicants must answer a series of online questions about their management of health and safety risks during the previous year which are assessed by a team of independent chartered health and safety professionals. If the application meets the required standard, a pass, merit or – for exceptional submissions – a distinction is awarded.

Selected high scoring winning organisations are shortlisted for additional recognising auto entry awards including Sector, Company, Country, and a Chief Adjudicators Award for the highest scoring applicant/s. These awards are judged by independent adjudicator panels.

The International Safety Awards scheme also features seven free to enter awards to recognise exceptional individual, organisation-wide and team performance in the areas of health, safety and wellbeing professionals. These include the following awards:

- The CEO Award 2022
- Health, Safety and Wellbeing Ambassador Award of the Year Award
- Team of the Year Award
- The James Tye Award
- Wellbeing Initiative Powered by Being Well Together
- Health and Safety Transformation Award – Sponsored by Croner-i
- Seize the Opportunity Award

The winners of the auto and free to enter awards will be announced in the May edition of Safety Management Magazine.

Whilst we haven't been able to run the hugely popular International Safety Awards gala dinner over the last couple of years, we are looking at the feasibility of a 2022 event. However, we are very aware that even though many restrictions have been relaxed in the UK, this isn't necessarily the situation elsewhere.
